	1.	Arminianism: Man can do and God's grace enables man to choose Him, but man can reject this grace.	
	2.	5-Point Calvinism: Man is to respond to God and God predetermines everyone – some to heaven and some to hell.	
	3.	Free Grace: Man is, and has the ability to respond, to God's grace upon hearing the gospel plus coming under the conviction of the Holy Spirit.	
IV.	Det	fining God's Sovereignty	
	1.	God's sovereignty is a concept. Psalm 115:3, Isaiah 46:9b-10	
	2.	Sovereignty may not mean God always gets everything He, but He does get everything He decrees/will.	
	3.	Under Augustine, sovereignty became manipulative micromanagement of every in the universe. This view was later adopted by John Calvin.	

V. Free Grace Theology & God's Sovereignty

1.	: Salvation is a gracious free gift from God, dependent entirely on the Lord Jesus Christ who died for our sins and was raised from the dead, and who promises to give forgiveness and eternal life to all who trust in Him. (Romans 1:1-4, 1 Cor. 15;1-4, John 3:16-18)		
2.	: Although Jesus promises to change a person who trusts in Him, we do not need to have good works to earn our salvation, prove our salvation or keep our salvation. (Eph. 2:8-9)		
3.	: Those who trust in the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior are united with Christ in His death and resurrection and become new creatures who can never lose their eternal relationship with God.		
4.	(Eph. 1:13, Rom. 8:31-39): Those who trust in the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior can have assurance of their salvation immediately, based upon Scripture. (1 John 5:11-13)		
5.	: God loved the world so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to die for the sins of all mankind. (John 3:16, 1 John 2:2)		
VI. So What?			
1.	It is legitimate to ask whether it is even to explain everything about God, or whether some things are beyond our ability to fully understand and explain.		
2.	We should study the of and form opinions, but with a great deal of humility and from an honest treatment of the Scriptures.		
3.	Focusing on one's leads us to our position. Focusing on one's position leads us to grow in our condition.
